Anglo-Saxon Syllable Patterns

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Anglo-Saxon Syllable Types

- Closed (short vowel) *mat, flip, cot, lump, fled*
- Vowel-Consonant-e (long vowel) *skate, time, remote*
- Open (long vowel) *go, baby, pilot, vacation*
- Vowel Pair (sound of digraph) *team, steel, coin, road*
- Consonant -le *turtle, apple, table, eagle, puzzle, gargle*
- -r Controlled *chart, forlorn, term, chirp, burp*

Patterns for Syllable Division

- VC/CV (short vowel sound): *hap/pen, sum/mer, ban/ner, sup/per, nap/kin, ban/dit, can/did, thun/der.*
- V/CV (long vowel sound): *spi/der, bo/nus, la/bel, be/gan, ve/to, fe/ver, clo/ver.*
- VC/V (short vowel): *cab/in, lim/it, com/et, van/ish, rob/in, blem/ish, tal/ent.*
- VCCCV: Divide after the vowel (re/strict), the 1st consonant (hun/dred), or 2nd consonant (lamp/post).
- V/VC: *bo/a, cre/ate, o/a/sis, flu/id, zo/ol/o/gy.*
